We are involved in two student exchanges this term. On October 25, we will welcome a group of faculty and students from the Harrison College in Bridgetown, Barbados. We hope to be in Barbados in February 2024. They will be twined with staff and students here for five days of school. On December 10, we plan to visit with our longstanding exchange partners from Polyvalente La Samare in Quebec, Canada. They will visit with us in March 2024. This exchange may close after twenty-two years.

- Once students exit the campus after dismissal, they are not allowed to return.
- Students are not to congregate or collect anything from anyone at the gate or along the fence line.
- Discuss with your child the dangers of unsafe use of the Internet.
- Discuss with child/ward the dangers of irresponsible use of their cellular phones.
- Discuss with your child the dangers of consuming, inhaling or smoking drugs.
- Please encourage your child/ward to first report to teachers, guidance counsellors and the Dean any attempts at bullying or offer of contraband by anyone.
- Students must keep their property in sight at all times.
